

This area was a sitio of a town known as "Numancia," after a place in Spain. In 1898, through the effort and leadership of Ambrosio Abuana, the name Numancia was changed to Abuanan, which later became Barrio Abuanan under the jurisdiction of the Municipality of Bago.



They did so hoping that these outlaws would protect them. From then on, they formed a community later named by the Spaniards "Alianza", which means alliance of forces.

They organized "rondas" among their brave men and made "toltogan" to alert the people at the first detection of intruders. The name Atipuluan may have been derived from the word "ati" who infested the area during that time and the place was the "puloy-an" or abode of this group of people.







The child crying, shouted "mahaw, mahaw" ("I want breakfast"). The Spaniard thought the place was "Mahaw" (later Ma-ao).

Still another tale said that, people from the mountain coming down usually ate their breakfast at this particular point, thus the word "mahao" meant the point where they got hungry and ate breakfast.














The place is named after a kind of grass with thorny vines, "sampinit" that thrived in the swamps around the Barangay.

Prior to the famous revolution led by General Juan Anacleto Araneta on November 5, 1898, Sampinit was part of the pueblo known as Bago. The first cluster of families lived in what was known as Sitio Pinanuy-an.

Sometime in the middle of the 19th century there was massive immigration to Negros of people coming from Panay brought about by the development of the sugar industry. Many of these laborers, also called "sacadas", stayed after the milling season to clear portions of the forest and to acquire parcels of land.

Fearful that the land which they already called their own would be grabbed by other immigrants, they planted land markers around their acquired areas using bamboo or wooden posts which were called "ta-loc". It is said that from this word came the name of Barangay Taloc.




