

Malacañan Palace declares February 19 holiday in Bago

In celebration of the 52nd Charter Anniversary of Bago, Malacañan Palace declared February 19 as special nonworking day here in the City.

Executive Secretary Salvador Medialdea, by authority President, Rodrigo Roa Duterte, signed Proclamation No. 411 last January 23.

The holiday was declared for the people of Bago to be given full opportunity to celebrate and participate in the occasion with appropriate ceremonies, the proclamation said.

In a message, Mayor Nicholas M. Yulo thanked the Palace for the said proclamation.

Bago became a chartered city by virtue of Republic Act 4382 and was inaugurated on February 19, 1966 with former Executive Secretary Rafael M. Salas, a Bagonhon, as special quest.

Former Mayor Manuel "Tutay" Torres was the hold-over mayor along with Juan Y. Araneta as the first City Vice Mayor.

The first City Councilors include Atty. Arsenio B. Yulo, Romualdo S. Araneta, Gorgonio J. Ramos, Florencio Rosquillo, Alejandro Marquiño, Ramon Gonzaga, Donato T. Pison, and Querubin C. Villanueva, Sr.

Fifty two years ago, the first City Officials of Bago took their oath of office before Secretary Salas and Judge Guillermo Torres at the public plaza. It was also on this day that the new Bago City Hall was inaugurated with Doña Eva Serra, sister of Don J. Amado Araneta, and two Executive Secretaries, Rafael Salas and Jorge Vargas as the special

Longest'Lights of Bago' draws thousands amid rains

The annual Lights of Bago at Manuel Y. Torres Sports Center in Bago City, Negros Occidental gathered thousands of spectators, including local and foreign tourists, amid rains on Monday night.

Now on its 10th year, the 20-minute synchronized fireworks display witnessed by at least 5,000 people was the longest so far since the activity started in 2008.

In the previous years, the fireworks display lasted for only about 16 minutes.

Mayor Nicholas Yulo, at the sidelines of the event, said the activity has become a tradition for Bagonhons after it was institutionalized during the time of former mayor Ramon Torres, who now sits as the vice mayor.

Yulo said that aside from being a tourist attraction, the fireworks display is also staged to lessen firecracker-related injuries in the city.

"The law now strictly prohibits the use of pyrotechnics and firecrackers in non-designated areas thus, we enjoined Bagonhons and those from other cities and towns in the province to instead join us in welcoming the New Year in a safe and colorful way," he said.

Like the colorful lights in the sky, the city continues to have brighter aspirations this 2018, the mayor added.

It can be recalled that the staging of the annual event every January 1 was started by European Raymond Stoffel, a retired international corporate lawyer from Luxembourg, whose wife has roots at Barangay Poblacion in Bago City.

Stoffel had to go back to Europe which paved way for the City Government to assume the hosting of the musical fireworks display since its second year.

From a Michael Jackson inspired display in 2017, this year's Lights of Bago is centered on the theme "Love, Peace and Unity."

David Villanueva, the fireworks provider, said the city government wanted to highlight the message of love, peace and unity as this is what the world needs today.

"It gives hope to the people as the world gets more complicated and broken," Villanueva said, adding that this vear's longer and grander sequence of fireworks were synchronized with more mellow songs bearing the said message.

Councilor Andrew Martin Torres, chairman of 10th Lights of Bago, said the annual activity has become a must-see event in the province every year.

"We are really trying our best to improve the Lights of Bago every year," he said, adding that this year's budget is bigger compared to those of the previous years. / SunStar Bacolod

2018 Business One- Stop Shop (BOSS) a success

The conduct of Business One- Stop Shop (BOSS) in Bago City was successful according to the City Permits and Licensing Division which spearheaded the annual business permit processing every January.

Division head Ma. Carmen Lopez made the comment when asked about the annual BOSS which opened on January 3 and extended until February 8 at the Bago City Community Center and at the DTI Negosyo Center.

As of press time, the City Mayor's Office issued 4,045 business permits, 2,604 for tricycles and 1,441 for business renewal.

The BOSS aims to make easier and faster the business permit transaction in the city. It is also in line with the vision of the local government of making Bago a business-friendly city. Also, business owners were given No Smoking posters and stickers that they will post in compliance with the No Smoking ordinance of the City and the Executive Order from President Rodrigo Duterte.

With the one-stop shop, business owners can fast track the processing of permits, and save time and money at the same time. It caters to both renewal of business permits or registration of new businesses.

All government agencies including Bureau of Fire Protection, City Health Office, Environment, Traffic, SSS, City Mayor's Office, Permits and Licensing Division, City Treasurer's Office-Licensing Division, and City Planning and Development Office-Zoning Division, needed to sign the business permits have set up their tables at the Community Center and Negosyo Center.

The process has been streamlined from five steps into three steps to ensure a faster service, and with accomplished requirements, the permit can be issued in one to two days.

BOSS is in line with Republic Act 9485, or the Anti-Red Tape Act of 2009, which directs all government offices to improve efficiency in the delivery of government services to the public by reducing the bureaucratic red tape and preventing graft and corruption.

"Red tape" is a term for "excessive regulation or rigid conformity to formal rules that is considered redundant or bureaucratic and hinders or prevents action or decision-making.

Firecracker-related injuries down 70% in Bago

Mayor Nicholas Yulo lauded the Local Task Force on Iwas Paputok for the lower number of firecracker-related casualties this year and the police for a "generally peaceful" celebration of the holidays in Bago.

"I congratulate the City Task Force on Iwas Paputok for its very successful campaign and the Philippine National Police (PNP), together with the 24 barangay captains, for a generally peaceful celebration of Christmas and New Year," Mayor Yulo said in a statement.

According to Violence and Injury Prevention Coordinator Ceander V. Rosquillo, Bago has only 6 cases of reported firecracker injuries from December 21, 2017 to January 5, 2018 and have greatly reduced by 70% compared to the same surveillance period last year which resulted to 20 cases.

In 2017, Bago was number one in Western Visayas with the highest number of recorded cases. But this year, with massive information dissemination campaign on the hazards of firecrackers and with the order from President Duterte, a substantial decrease in the number of cases was recorded.

Mayor Yulo also added that the conduct of the Lights of Bago, a musical fireworks show, greatly helped in reducing the number of cases also. "The executive order from the President restricting the use of firecrackers to community zones was followed in our City," the mayor added.

Complainants can report violations at the City Health Office hotline (034) 461-0118. Violators of the said can be fined up to P5,000.



Mayor Nicholas M. Yulo delivered his first State of the City Address (SOCA) during the 1, 888th regular session of the Sangguniang Panlungsod of Bago at Manuel Y. Torres Memorial Coliseum and Cultural Center on August 30.

Mayor Yulo said his administration will focus on agricultural productivity and tourism promotions and development.

"Ours is an agri-industrial economy and there is no perfect way to better improve the standard of living of our people except by encouraging our agricultural producers to improve their craft and be the best that they can be," he said.

He said the government should also provide technical, logistical and market support to ensure that agricultural remains a sustainable livelihood for the Bagonhons.

He said he is sensitive to the the calling of Governor Alfredo Marañon about food security.

Bago is the rice granary of Negros Occidental and he wants to position the city as the food basket of the province, adding that his administration have to concentrate on their strength which is agriculture.

He said in the area of tourism, Bago City is blessed with natural endowments, historical significance, and cultural heritage.

"What we need to focus on is improving the culture of tourism among our people, instill a sense of discipline and order, and develop our attractions and facilities to be more tourist-friendly," Yulo said.

"We are capitalizing on agriculture and tourism because these are our biggest potentials," he added.

The mayor said that as urbanization expansion of the neighboring Bacolod City is going towards north, his administration will concentrate on developing their agricultural strengths.

Among agricultural sector gains he reported included the city's rice development and hybridization programs which provided farm inputs to about 1, 200 rice farmers totaling to about P13 million funded through the trust fund and the Department of Agriculture budget.

The City Government has also initiated the rehabilitation and development programs for rice and the other crop farmers, and fisherfolks by collaborating with the DA, Provincial Government, and other government agencies.

Yulo said Bago is also taking pride in having one of the most outstanding farmers in the Philippines in the person of Pastor Jerry Dionson, who is again vying for this year's National Organic Agriculture Achiever's Award.

Inthelivestockindustry development, he said, that the Karabag-o Carabao Development Program continues to increase the genetic potential of the native carabao especially for meat and milk which has significantly helped increase income and nutritional status of farming communities.

He further reported that the cityowned and operated resorts continue to attract local and foreign tourists.

He said the city has generated almost P10.6 million in sales since last year in Buenos Aires Mountain Resort alone.

Upon his assumption into office last year, he had called upon the bureaucracy in various meetings and have endeavored to assess the performance of the different offices, and together they have slowly implemented the suggested recommendations on how they can improve the delivery of services to the constituency, he said.

Bago City have surpassed the 2016 business revenue collections amounting to P16.5 million by collecting P20.2 million as of August, or an increase of P3.7 million or about 22.8 percent.

The City have implemented a total of P 105.5 million worth of either completed

or ongoing infrastructure projects, and spent P25.8 million in the implementation of various water supply projects, he said.

They also plan to construct a 2-storey Jubilee Building were the first floor will be where the Sanggunian session hall will be located, while the ground floor will be an open space for meetings or conferences, he said.

Other points the Mayor mentioned in his address included city's major accomplishments including awards and recognitions, infrastructure development, provision of more health and education services, livelihood programs, and improved peace and order, among others.

"We continue to ask for the cooperation of our constituents especially in sustaining and flourishing these initials gains," Yulo said.

He also pointed out that Bagonhons are now receptive to the programs of the government and they just need a little more encouragement and support. /






