AFI launches CENTEX, LeadCom programs in Bago

The City Government of Bago and the Ayala Foundation Inc. (AFI) launched on February 1 the Leadership Communities (LeadCom) and CENTEX training programs, that will benefit 30 public elementary school teachers, 10 youth school leaders, and community-based and youth organizations.

The launching was attended by Bago City officials led by Mayor Nicholas Yulo, Joanna Duarte, Ayala Foundation senior director for Operations, and DepEd Bago officials led by SDS Dr. Neri Anne Alibuyog.

It can be recalled that Bago City and Ayala Foundation signed a back-to-back MOA in Makati City on September 26, 2018.

The first one was for the implementation of the Leadership Communities (LeadCom) Project which trains and empower the youth by helping them design and implement relevant projects that address the problems in the community.

The other one is the CENTEX program or the Center of Excellence in Public

Elementary Education, a 3- year principal and teachers training module, to assist the Department of Education through its Division of Schools in the development of teacher effectiveness.

Under the CENTEX Training Institute agreement, one public elementary

school with 30 teachers and 10 principals in Bago City will be the beneficiaries of the said program. The total program cost is P3, 300,000 and the AFI shall provide the 60% while the City of Bago will counterpart the remaining 40% of the total cost of the said project. /AAB

The proclamation was issued so "the people of the City of Bago be given full opportunity to celebrate and participate in the occasion with appropriate ceremonies."

Mayor Nicholas Yulo thanked the Palace for the issuance of the said proclamation.

Bago became a chartered city by virtue of Republic Act 4382 and was inaugurated on February 19, 1966.

Bago City hosted National Commission for Culture and the Arts' (NCCA) opening of the 2019 National Arts Month on February 1.

Dubbed as "Paghabol: Weaving the Arts in the Visayas", and anchored on the national theme "Aning Sining", the celebration opened in the morning with an Arts Fair at the Manuel Y. Torres Memorial Coliseum and Cultural Center.

Bagonhon students coming from various schools enjoyed the workshops on Baybayin, calligraphy, photography, and upcycling art, alongside booths featuring hablon and banig weaving, face painting, mask making and henna tattooing which were held in the morning.

Performances on spoken word poetry and dance alongside features on Arts in public spaces were also showcased to the delight of the audience.

The Balay ni Tan Juan Museum hosted an exhibit featuring the photos on the arts, festivals, food, and heritage sites of ace lensman and Bagonhon Ronnie Baldonado.

In the afternoon, the official declaration of the the Arts Month Opening was held in a ceremony set at the MYTMCCC. SP Committee on Culture and Heritage

Ani ng Sining: Philippine Arts Festival will be composed of the flagship projects of SCA's seven national committees—Architecture, Cinema, Dance, Literary Arts, Music, Dramatic Arts and Visual Arts—which will be held in different venues all over the country.

Apart from the opening in Bago City, NCCA will also hold opening ceremonies for NAM in the National Capital Region (NCR), Luzon, and Mindanao. For NCR, Lucky Chinatown Mall in Binondo, Manila, will host the opening on February 3, while in Luzon, it will be in the municipality of Bagac in Bataan on February 11. Opening ceremonies will also be held in Koronadal City, South Cotabato, on February 15, for Mindanao.

For the whole of February, expect a plethora of activities such as exhibits, workshops, shows, concerts, lectures, tours and others happening in different parts of the country.

Bago wins top prize in nat'l street dance contest

The City of Bago was declared champion in the national street dance theater category of the Dulansangan 2019 in Malolos City, Bulacan on January 23.

The competition held at the Malolos Sports and Convention Center was part of the Fiesta Republica 2019 held in commemoration of the 120th anniversary of the First Philippine Republic.

Mayor Nicholas Yulo led city officials in witnessing the presentation of Bago City, which was the lone contingent from the Visayas.

This year, Bago is composed of 130 performers who presented the "Legend of Tan Juan," or General Juan Anacleto Araneta, one of the Negrense revolutionary heroes from Bago.

Dulansangan is a street dance-drama competition showcasing historical vignettes depicting the distinctive heroic event in the respective localities of the performing groups that compete in three levels -- local, provincial and national.

It was on Jan. 23, 1899 when the First Philippine Republic was established, marking the beginning of Filipino democracy.

President Rodrigo Duterte signed into law Republic Act 110141, "An act declaring January 23 of every year a special working holiday in the entire country to commemorate the declaration of the First Philippine Republic". /PNA


The City Government of Bago awarded the winners of the Photo Contest, held as a highlight of the January 1 Lights of Bago Fireworks Show, on January 18.

Chicken multiplier farm opens in Bago

The Provincial Veterinary Office recently opened a free-range chicken Multiplier Farm in Bago City, Negros Occidental, to boost the production of free-range chicken in the province.

The PVO said the province, partnership with the local government units, builds multiplier farms through the construction of the building, giving of initial stocks of 150 heads, and putting a brooder for chicks and an incubator, while the LGU will provide the land area, operation and management of the farm.

It also said that the LGU shall undertake a continuing dispersal of chickens to its constituents as its obligation to sustain the province's poultry production effort under both its Animal Genetic Improvement Program for free-range chicken and Animal Livelihood.

The province has established eight multiplier farms for FRC and five for duck production in 13 LGUpartners this year and another eight poultry multipliers are scheduled to be established next year, the PVO also said.

Bago City's FRC multiplier farm has a breeder population of 150 heads, 2.5 months old weighing an average of 1.5-kilograms and expected to produce eggs in a month.

The project is expected to boost chicken production in Bago and nearby areas being the source of good quality chicks and which may be replicated by commercial raisers, the press release added.

The farm is managed by the Bago City Veterinary Office, headed by Dr. Martin Manuel Samuel Espinosa Torres. /VDS

Bago traders, retailers comply rice SRPs

RICE traders and retailers in Bago City are compliant with the suggested retail prices (SRPs) set for milled rice, the Local Price Coordinating Council (LPCC) on November 21, reported.

The council chaired by Mayor Nicholas Yulo has been conducting strict monitoring among markets and other rice-selling outlets in the city, it said.

LPCC, also composed of the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) as vice chair and City Agriculture Office, is also closely coordinating with the Joint Inspection and Enforcement Team.

Aside from SRPs, prescribed labeling of rice boxes and price tags were also implemented in the city, it added.

The National Food Authority (NFA) in Negros Occidental earlier said it is also strictly monitoring the compliance on SRPs which took effect on November 11.

This is 15 days after the implementing guidelines were published in a newspaper of general circulation on

Based on the general guidelines stated on the Memorandum Circular Agriculture Secretary issued by Emmanuel Piñol on October 24, the SRPs set for local rice range from P39 to P47 per kilogram depending on classification.

Regular milled rice costs P39 per kilogram while well-milled and premium

rice cost P44 to P47 per kilogram, respectively.

For imported rice, on the other hand, the SRP for well-milled is P39 per kilogram while those for premium grade one and two are P43 and P40 per kilogram, respectively.

Under the guidelines, special rice such as glutinous, aromatic, pigmented, japonica, and micronutrient-dense rice are not covered by the SRPs.

Aside from the SRPs, the agency also set prescribed standard specifications on the labeling of rice boxes and price tags.

The classification of rice should only

be regular milled, well-milled, premium grade, and special rice.

Also, the classification in rice boxes shall be printed in black bold letters with white background.

In terms of price tags, the circular stated the prescribed information shall be the price per kilogram.

The guidelines further stated that any violation shall be subjected to the penal provisions of existing laws, rules and regulations including but not limited to the Price Act and the Revised Rules and Regulations of the NFA on grains business. / SunStar Bacolod

Bago 263.8% rice sufficient in 2018

Bago City, the rice granary of Occidental, Negros attained 263-percent rice sufficiency in 2018, City Agriculturist, Carlito Indencia, said vesterday.

Indencia told the DAILY STAR that the rice sufficiency of Bago reached 263.82 percent last year, an increase of about 35 percent compared to 228 percent in 2017.

The current rice sufficiency of Bago translates to 119,528 metric tons of rice production, with an average of 4.43 metric tons yield per hectare.

In 2017, the city produced about 107,000MT of rice with an average of 4.2MT yield per hectare, records show. Indencia said the increase in

production is attributed to less minimal crop losses due to calamities, facilities and technology distributed, education given to the farmers, and more support from the city government through allocating a budget to develop agriculture in Bago.

"The Bago City government has been leading the initiative to improve agriculture, especially for rice, by supporting farmers into growing and producing more of this crop," he said.

Indencia also said that last year, the city had planted more rice areas compared to 2017.

He said the city spent much on distributing quality seeds that are under the hybridization program, that

aims to increase the rice yield in Bago.

The target in 2016 was to increase to at least 500 kilos the yield in 2018. Three years ago, the production was at 3.9MT per hectare and now it has risen to 4.43MT, he added.

Indencia also said he hopes this rice sufficiency rate in Bago will greatly contribute to attaining 100 percent rice sufficiency in the province.

In 2019, the city government aims to reach the 4.5MT per hectare mark, in terms of yield, by pushing Bagonhon farmers to use hybrid rice seeds. he said.

The southern part of Bago is still in the third cropping, and the first cropping for 2019 will start in the northern part in June, he said.

Barangays that are still in third cropping are Lag-asan, Pacol, Bagroy, Caridad, Sagasa, Alianza, and parts of Napoles and Malinging. Rice harvest is expected on the last week of June, Indencia said.

Those that belong to the northern Bago rice areas are barangays Tabunan, Dulao, Taloc, Abuanan, and parts of Antipuluan, Malingin, and Busay. He added that irrigation in the area will open on the last week of May. / Visayan Daily Star

Regional Evacuation Center ready for use

The P36 million regional evacuation center in Bago City is now ready for use.

Ricardo Undersecretary administrator of the Office of the Civil Defense, said during the blessing and turn-over of the newly-completed regional evacuation center in Brgy. Lagasan, on November 16, can accommodate as much as 300 families.

The event was attended by Bago City Officials led by Mayor Nicholas Yulo, OCD regional head Jose Roberto Nuñez, DWSD regional director Rebecca Geamala, officials of the Department of Public Works and Highways, and Bago DRRM led by Dr. Merigene Ortizo.

The regional evacuation center is equipped with water, a generator set, lighting, and billeting facilities, a clinic, an isolation room, a mess hall, and washing area with comfort rooms, among others.

Jalad said that the concerned local government unit will maintain the evacuation center.

Bago City Mayor Nicholas Yulo yesterday said that he will enlist the help of neighboring local government units in

Bantayan Park to get P19-M for dev't

A former natural accretion turned into a riverfront park in Bago City will now be developed into a green space with the P19 million funding from the Department of Budget and Management.

Bago City's Bantayan Riverfront Park is one of the projects that will be funded by the DBM through its "Green, Green, Green" program that aims to create green spaces in the 145 cities of the country.

The website of the DBM said that Bago. along with four other cities in the country, will redesign their waterways into parks to engage citizens and rejuvenate the area.

Mayor Nicholas Yulo said yesterday that the improvement of Bantayan Riverfront Park will cost, roughly, P19 million.

He said that Bantayan was just a natural accretion of the Bago River before, but the administration of then Mayor Ramon Torres initiated its development to give Bagonhons space for tourism opportunities.

The "Green, Green, Green" program is funded under the Local Government Support Fund-Assistance to Cities to support the open space development program of the government and was launched 2017.

This is a parallel endeavor to the massive national infrastructure development program "Build, Build, Build", the DBM said.

The 1-kilometer long Bantayan Park will be developed into a pedestrian and

bike-friendly space and its existing road will undergo improvement, in terms of accessibility and lanes for bikers that will be separated by planting a strip for safety.

DBM also said that the project in Bago will have seating areas near the edge of the river and more trees and shrubs will be added for a more pleasant microclimate.

Along with Bago, also to be developed are the river esplanades in the cities of Bacoor, Dasmariñas, Malabon, and Parañague. The Metro Manila cities will host small river parks, the DBM added.

conducted technical has workshops with the 145 cities involved in the program, focused on the best practices in public space designs and policies and procedures for its implementation.

About 100 cities are now processing

their project proposals that express their interests in availing of the funds.

The open spaces included in the program are 10 new government centers, 20 public squares and plazas, two mangrove areas, 54 parks and waterfronts, and 13 streets, among others.

Yulo also said that Bantayan has about 22 hectares of claimed area and with its development, it is seen to be one of the new tourist destinations in Bago City, with spaces used for commercial, tourism, and relaxation purposes of visitors.

He also said that the fund is expected to be downloaded by the city government within this month as it is targeted to immediately start the bidding and finish the development within 2019. /Visayan **Daily Star**



Yulo said the city government recognizes the need to assist the farmers to attain rice industry development. "The distribution of farm machinery has contributed to the improvement (of rice yield)," the mayor said.

As of November, this year, Bago City's average rice yield was pegged at 4.4 metric tons per hectare, higher than the 4.1 metric tons per hectare in 2017.

"By boosting our production, we can also contribute to increasing the province's rice sufficiency level and ensuring food security," Yulo added.

Dubbed as the rice granary of Negros Occidental, Bago City's contribution to the province's total rice production is about 19 percent.

Farm machinery units, including a hand tractor, two thresher, one multitilling machine, three rice planting machines, and five pumps with engines, were distributed to 10 farmers association-recipients.

These included the Punta Playa Multi-Purpose Association, Mailum Organic Village Association, Barangay Napoles Women Association for Rural

Improvement, Fermina Small Water Impounding System Association, Bago Integrated Farmers Association, Small Farmers Association of Abuanan, Dulao and Antipuluan. Newton-Camingawan-Para Farmers Association, Barangay Malingin Farmers Association. Association of Rice Farmers of Tabunan. and Sagasa Women's Group.

They also received livelihood projects like "balut" (fertilized duck eggs) making, food processing, salted egg making, and mushroom production.

Four fisherfolk associations, including Taloc Baybay Fisherfolk Association, Calubay Anahaw Small Fishermen Association, Can-itum

Integrated Fisherfolk Association, and Barangay Calumangan Integrated Fisherfolk Association, were provided alternative livelihood projects such as fish vending, rag making as well as cooking equipment and facilities.

Indencia said that the machinery and livelihood projects are funded by the city government through its Agriculture Development Program.

"The program covers the city's measure to develop its rice and fishery sectors," he said, adding that it also aims to provide farmers and fisherfolk alternative sources of income through the livelihood development component. / PNA



Expenditures By Expense Class






